MINUTES

BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS BUDGET HEARING

November 14, 2022, 7:00 p.m. Station 21 and Zoom

ATTENDANCE:

CALL TO ORDER:

Commissioner Frank called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

No comments received.

BUSINESS:

- **1. 2023 Proposed Budget** Commissioners received budget information prior to the meeting. Secretary Rewitzer presented the 2023 Budget Proposal:
 - Per the County Assessor, real and personal property tax revenue should be budgeted at \$501,000 for general fire and \$280,000 for EMS.
 - Total revenue is projected to be \$1,069,500 which is a 15.1% increase over 2022.
 - Total expense is projected to be \$968,320 which is a 12.7% increase over 2022. The budget proposal with existing staffing would leave a surplus of \$101,180.
 - Adding one career firefighter is projected to cost \$68,906 and would leave a budget surplus of \$32,220. Adding two career firefighters is projected to cost 142,090 and would leave a budget deficit of \$40,910.
 - Commissioners were reminded that findings of the Department of Retirement Systems (DRS) audit required changes in the extent to which volunteers are used to staff shifts going forward.

Commissioners discussed the budget proposal and staffing concerns. Commissioner Frank moved to accept the 2023 budget as presented (without additional staffing).

- Discussion involved funding for additional staffing.
- Commissioner Kelbon offered an amendment to include additional staffing.
- Chief McKern commented that a federal Staffing For Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) grant could be applied for. Also, the current

general fire levy rate is at \$0.89 from the approved rate of \$1.25 so a general fire levy lift could be considered.

Commissioner Frank withdrew the motion.

Commissioner Kelbon moved to accept the 2023 budget as presented with the addition of two career firefighters. Commissioner Bacchus seconded. The motion carried with Commissioner Frank opposing.

Commissioners directed staff to provide a schedule, hiring process, and strategy for funding the additional positions beyond 2023. Chief McKern said the positions would be temporary pending a SAFER grant award.

2. Levy Certification & Resolution – Secretary Rewitzer presented Resolution 2022-008 Authorizing a Property Tax Levy for General Fire (a resolution authorizing a property tax levy for EMS is not needed because 2023 is the first year of the voter approved EMS levy renewal). Commissioner Frank moved to adopt the resolution. Commissioner Bacchus seconded. The motion carried.

Secretary Rewitzer presented a Levy Certification based on numbers provided by the County Assessor. Secretary Rewitzer presented a Budget Certification based on numbers provided by the County Assessor. The Budget Certification will include a copy of the 2023 Budget once it is updated and formatted in BIAS. Commissioners signed the Budget Certification. Secretary Rewitzer will file the certifications with Jefferson County in accordance with RCW 84.52.020.

ADJOURNMENT:

The meeting was adjourned at 8:12 p.m.
